Parish Council Activities

Meetings

Grange Park Parish Council meets at the Community Centre on the first Thursday of each month. Meetings start at 7:00pm. The agenda is posted on the notice boards within Grange Park at least 3 days before the meeting. The Noticeboards are located at the Community Centre, outside Budgens and at the entrance of Foxfields Country Park. Minutes from each of the Parish Council meetings will be posted on our website approximately 1 month after the meeting date. These meetings are open to the Public and Press

Highways

The roads within Grange Park have still not been adopted although meetings have taken place with Northampton Highways Authority and the developers to process this issue in the near future.

The only roads which have been adopted within the Parish are Saxon Avenue and Rowan Way (by the commercial buildings). All road maintenance and street lighting is therefore still the responsibility of the respective housing developers.

Foxfields Pavilion

The Sports and Recreation building at Foxfields Country Park has been a slow process, the main reason for the delay is that the Parish Council had to terminate the contract of the appointed builder Inspire Contracting due to default in their contract 'Failure to proceed regularly and diligently with the works of the JCT 2005 Intermediate Building Contract'. We have now been lucky to appoint a local builder Chris Smith who will complete the remaining works within the next 6-8 weeks. The drainage work is nearly completed with just some minor remedial work to be done later in May (weather permitting)

Cricket Square

A new cricket square has been installed at Foxfield Country Park in June of this year. The funding for this project had been given to us as compensation from Henry Davidson Developments and payments from Chiltern Hundreds Housing Association for forgoing the freehold on the health facilities located at Grange Park. The above compensation could only be spent on projects associated with Foxfields. It is hoped that the above facility will be used in 2010/11 once the outfield drainage works have been completed and settled. The paths at Foxfield are kept under constant review.

Multi-Use Games Area

Grange Park Parish Council has considered the possibility of installing a Multi-Use Games Area to be open and used by the youths of Grange Park. Unfortunately due to planning regulation/conditions we have been unable at present to find a suitable site.

It was agreed in November that we have funding to provide a youth shelter at Grange Valley Greenway. We are currently waiting for the legal transfer of land.

Community Activities

Once again this year the Parish Council organised a Community Firework Display which was well attended and appreciated by the majority of residents within the Community. Estimated attendance 1500.

The events committee in conjunction with two local residents organised a Family Fun Day on the 31st May 2009. The day was very successful, supported and well attended by many residents.

During the school holidays the Parish Council arranged with South Northamptonshire District Council the use of a skateboard ramp and climbing wall every Wednesday evening from 4.30 - 6.30pm

A Pet Show was also organised and well supported.

Neighbourhood Watch is active within the community and regularly meetings are organised, if you have any concerns, please contact your local co-ordinator.

Ongoing attempts have been made to start a Youth Forum within the Parish but needs more active participation form the youths in order to progress any projects.

Environment

A 3 year Maintenance contract has been entered into with Quartet Design and Frosts Landscapes which will include litter picking, playground inspections, grass cutting (some areas only) and arboreal work. The areas which are not yet included in the contract are Alamien and Spinney Woods, Grange Valley Greenway (area at the back of Woodland View Primary School), Wootton Brook Country Park and the District Centre. If you have any suggestions or complaints regarding any areas within the above contract, please do not hesitate in contacting the Parish Office who will forward your concerns to the contractor and hopefully a solution will be found

The Parish Council have also agreed to a 3 year programme for the thinning of the pioneers within the Parish – the first phase has been done this year and the second phase is due later in the Autumn 2010

Public Consultations

During the year Grange Park Parish Council has consulted the public by using the Grange Park News letter, noticeboards and the website, detailing parish issues, updates on Foxfields Country Park, Community Activities, Planning etc.

The Parish Council have decided this year (2010/11) so as to keep the precept at a reasonable rate, to use all the remaining balance from 2009/10 within our day to day budget requirements.

Due to VAT issues the Parish Council have been advised by HM Revenue and Customs that we would need to set up a separate Management Committee to run the hiring facilities at the Community Centre and Foxfields Sports and Recreation Pavilion. The Parish Council have appointed a Solicitor from Hewiston's to lead and manage us through this process. Formation, consultation and implementation will happen during 2010/11.
